The most important issues for the Wayland Free Public Library today are how to continually adapt to the community's needs for information resources, and the challenges of the Library's building. As an older building, the Library requires continued maintenance, improved accessibility, and creative rethinking of how the space inside the building is used. The Town has budgeted a limited amount for this work, but more support is necessary. The Library is currently developing a new five-year strategic plan, working with members of the Wayland community, to understand and respond to what the community needs today and in the future.
